

As a resident at [REDACTED], Blackwood for more than 50 years I feel qualified to comment on the absurdity of freight trains thundering through the night accompanied by a high-pitched squeal to transport goods from one State to another, disturbing beyond endurance, the peace and quiet of residents living along the route of the Hills railway line. The time has long since passed when any far-sighted government would have displayed a certain degree of vision and wisdom to move the freight train route out of the Adelaide Hills to a location where the surrounding population would be less affected by the gross intrusion into the lives of everyone living along its screeching route.
