Toodyay Road Upgrade - Dryandra to Toodyay

Project description

The project will undertake realignments of sub-standard curves, intersection improvements, provision of passing lanes and seal widening on Toodyay Road from Dryandra to Toodyay.

Toodyay Road forms part of the Roe Highway to Toodyay Route that links the north-eastern Wheatbelt to the Perth metropolitan area. This project aims to improve road safety for all road users, and improve travel times and freight performance. The route currently services over 2,800 vehicles per day, and carries an increasing volume of commuter and tourist traffic and heavy vehicles, with heavy vehicles comprising 11.6 per cent of the daily traffic.

Jobs supported

- This project is expected to support 140 direct and indirect jobs based on Australian Government estimates

Project benefits

- Improved road safety for all road users
- Reduced congestion and improved travel times
- Improved connectivity between people with jobs and services, and goods with markets

Project timelines

- This project is expected to start construction in mid 2022 and be finished construction by mid 2026
