Project description

This project will upgrade the Pacific Highway through Wyong, including duplication of the highway between Johnson Road and Cutler Drive, Wyong. It will also replace the existing Wyong River road bridge with two new road bridges, improving overhead clearance heights for River Road and South Tacoma Road.

The population of the Central Coast is projected to increase by about 75,000 over the next 20 years with most of this increased forecast to occur in the area immediately north of Wyong. Currently, the highway is a major urban arterial with a single lane in each direction connecting Wyong's growing residential and employment areas to the north with the commercial and industrial precincts to the south.

This project will improve road safety for all users and reduce congestion.

Jobs supported

- This project is expected to support 955 direct and indirect jobs based on Australian Government estimates.

Project timelines

- This project is expected to commence construction in mid-2024 and be completed by mid-2027.
