Projects within the Tasmanian Roads Corridor:

Tasmanian Roads Package – Northern Roads Package – Stage 2

This project will deliver upgrades to the existing West Tamar Highway, including the duplication of lanes between Freshwater Point Road and Acropolis Drive, improvements to intersections, and the construction of cycling and pedestrian infrastructure.

Great Eastern Drive Tourism Support – additional packages

Extension of the successful Great Eastern Drive program to provide upgrades to width, adequate safe overtaking opportunities and intersections to improve safety.

Tasman Highway Sideling Upgrade – Stage 2

The Project will upgrade approximately 9 kilometres of the Tasman Highway at the Sideling between the access road near the Sideling Lookout and the Corkerays Road intersection.

West Tamar Highway targeted upgrades between Exeter and Launceston

The West Tamar Highway runs from Launceston to Greens Beach in the far north east of Tasmania. This project will deliver targeted upgrades between Exeter and Launceston to make this section of the West Tamar Highway safer and more efficient.
